



Open Funder Registry would just prepend all of their grant identifiers with the short prefix povided (and use virtually any structure they wanted to after the prefix). Again, for example, the identifier might look like this F8J23456. This identifier would minimally allow tools to automatically determine who was reponsible for issuing the grant identifier. It would not, however, have some of the other advanatges of being a DOI.

But later, if the funder decided that they wanted to use DOIs, register grant metadata and provide information to which the DOI could resolve, they could convert their identifiers to DOIs by prepending them with a DOI prefix. Again, in the above example, the identifier would become 10.19747/F8J23456. Both forms of identifiers would continue to work.
