





5.8 million registered users, over 40% of records are connected to at least one other item, and 73.6% have authorized updates


ACTIVE RECORDS WITH AT LEAST ONE CONNECTION






MEMBERS & INTEGRATIONS 2018

1,005 organizations in 45 countries, 584 total integrations, new ORCID consortia in Austria, Denmark, Greece, Israel, Portugal








COMMUNITY & TECH 2018

- <u>Community</u>: Ad hoc working groups/task forces
 (<u>funders</u>, <u>organization IDs</u>, <u>publishers</u>, <u>repositories</u>, <u>user facilities</u>)
- **Technology:** Moved all integrations to 2.0 and launched <u>API 3.0 beta</u> (affiliations, research resources, see the source, token delegation), upgrades to relational database to reduce outages and improve security
- Other: GDPR compliance, new user ticket system



FINANCIALS 2018

- Memberships: 144 new members, 97.3% retention of existing members
- Earned revenue: closing in on break-even
- Cash on-hand: cash balance to support operations beyond 2019

Establish ORCID's role as a trusted and neutral actor in sharing funding information










2019 STRATEGIC PROJECTS

- 1. **Academia and Beyond** expand understanding, use, and adoption of ORCID in Arts & Humanities and Clinical Medicine/Science communities
- 2. **Improve the User Experience** ensure a positive and consistent user experience and user accessibility across ORCID integrations
- 3. **Data Infrastructure -** ensure our APIs and databases scale with increasing community adoption
- 4. **Operations -** improve our back-office operational efficiency in areas that have a direct impact on the research community
- 5. **PID Power -** leverage the benefits of PID infrastructure to make the most out of iD-ID connections
- 6. **Person Citations -** expand our notion of "contribution" to include a corpus of a person's activities
- Sharing our Successes document and share ORCID successes and outcomes and identify gaps
- 8. **ORBIT -** engage research funders to use persistent identifiers to automate and streamline the flow of research information between systems
- 9. **RIPEN (Research Information Platform ENgagement) -** enable authenticated ORCID iD collection and secure cross-platform sharing of ORCID permission tokens






ORCID IN THE AMERICAS

- Four consortia
 (Brazil, Canada, US x2)
- 285 members in the Americas (263 in 2017)
- 1.35M increase in unique registry users in 2018 (57% increase)
 - 3.7M user total






AMERICAS 2019 PLANS

2020 BOARD ELECTIONS


We are seeking Board Directors to advise our strategy as we transition from a start-up to a mature, sustainable organization.

- Location in Asia Pacific, Africa, Europe, and Latin America






BEING A BOARD DIRECTOR

THE ELECTION PROCESS

- The Nominations Committee will assess all applications received by 1 August 2019 and develop a balanced slate, maintaining majority non-profit Board membership
- Voting by members will take place from 23 October 2019, and the results will be announced on 22 November 2019
- New Directors will start their terms on 1
 January 2020
- The first Board meeting of the term is
 11-12 February 2020 in London
