






THE FUTURE OF OPEN ACCESS BOOKS

The top 3 motivations for choosing OA

OA books are read

more widely

Research should be available to all

OA generates higher citations





Barriers to choosing OA



Inability to find funds

of non-OA book authors said that no OA book funding was available from their main funder or institution



Low awareness

of non-OA book authors were not familiar with OA



Perceptions of quality

of non-OA book authors thought OA books are likely to be perceived of lower quality



Lack of willingness to pay

of non-OA book authors were not willing to pay

Authors who have published OA books have strong pro-OA attitudes Non-OA book authors book authors would quite likely or very likely 37% publish a future OA book would publish an 41% OA chapter were very or quite likely 46% to self-archive prefer the policy for immediate 48% availability via gold route, or gold plus green route* thought it would be acceptable 28% 40% for their book to be used for commercial purposes
