FUNDING WORKFLOW PAIN POINTS

The ORCID Funder Working Group recommends using ORCID to:

- **Reduce the reporting burden.** Use information from ORCID records to fill forms and to track research results over time
- **Improve data quality.** Add authoritative information about funding to ORCID records
- **Automate information-sharing.** Enable systems and organizations to easily share information about researchers and their funding



ORCID IN FUNDING WORKFLOWS

Funders should use ORCID and other persistent identifiers to:

- **Support researchers.** Use data from ORCID records to auto-fill forms for your researchers and add information about funding to their records
- **Track and evaluate research results.** Maintain links with grantees - past, present, and future - to track the impact of your funding over time
- **Streamline reporting.** Enable easy information-sharing across systems within and between research organizations

ORCID IN PUBLISHING WORKFLOWS

Publishers should use ORCID and other persistent identifiers to:

- **Help your researchers.** Add information about their publications, other contributions, and service to their ORCID records so they can share it with their funders
- **Collect information** about funding from your authors' ORCID records, so that it can be included in their publications
- **Support funder compliance** and improve transparency by including identifiers (ORCID iDs, grant DOIs, organization IDs) in publication metadata

ORCID FOR RESEARCHERS

Researchers should use your ORCID iD to:

- **Connect with your research.** Ensure that you and your research are discoverable and that you get recognition you deserve
- **Save time.** Auto-fill forms when submitting a grant application or manuscript, and get your ORCID record automatically updated by your funders and publishers
- **Share your ORCID iD.** Enable grant information in your ORCID record to be included in the metadata for your publications


