# Impact of Covid-19 on Local Authority Archaeology Services



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This report was commissioned by The Association of Local Government Archaeological Officers (ALGAO:UK), which provides a forum for archaeologists working for local authorities and national parks throughout the UK. Members include metropolitan authorities, shire counties, unitary authorities, London boroughs, national parks and historic cities, towns and boroughs across England, Wales and Scotland as well as representatives from Northern Ireland.

Working for local government, ALGAO members have four key functions in order to encourage the identification, recording, protection, management, interpretation and promotion of archaeological sites and monuments:

- Maintain a record of the Historic Environment Record (HER) encompassing archaeological sites, monuments and landscapes.
- Provide advice and information on the care and management of the historic environment, especially through the planning system.
- Promote the recording, interpretation and understanding of the historic environment.
- Champion the historic environment's contribution to economic development and regeneration as well as learning, leisure, tourism and local distinctiveness.

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Data analysis was undertaken by Poppy German and maps & layout produced by Doug Rocks-Macqueen.

### 2 Executive Summary

This project was a rapid survey of ALGAO members, undertaken in June 2020, to ascertain the effects of the Covid-19 pandemic on their work. It found that the overwhelming majority of ALGAO members have been able to continue to deliver services as they were able to do before the onset of the pandemic. This means that the availability of local government advice has not been a factor leading to reductions in archaeological work.

Any reductions have been the consequence of wider restrictions on working being put in place to ensure the safety of workers.

Key findings:

- The majority (c.70%) of ALGAO members have continued to provide planning advice, policy advice, to comment on active developments and to provide Historic Environment Record services.
- The provision of non-planning-related advice to external groups and individuals, and other outward-facing activities, has reduced.
- 70% of ALGAO members report no change in the overall level of use of their service during Covid-19, although 28% have experienced a decline in use.
- Where staff have been furloughed, these are nearly all people working for services which are provided to local government by external trusts.
- Looking to the future, increases in budgets or staffing levels are not expected; many consider that either or both their budgets or staff complements could be reduced in the medium or long-term.

### 3 Introduction

#### 3.1 ALGAO

ALGAO is the Association of Local Government Archaeological Officers. The Association's members include metropolitan authorities, shire counties, unitary authorities, London boroughs, national parks and historic cities, towns and boroughs across England, Wales and Scotland as well as representatives from Northern Ireland and the Isle of Man. Membership is granted to all professional archaeologists in the employ of the local authority heritage team. The local authority is then represented by its most senior professional archaeologist whose primary responsibility is to advise that authority, principally through the planning process, on conservation and management of the archaeological resource, and who has been nominated by that authority to represent it for voting purposes.

Some ALGAO members are joint services providing advice for several local authorities, such as the Greater London Archaeology Advisory Service (providing advice to 31 London Boroughs) or the West of Scotland Archaeology Service (providing advice to 12 Scottish Councils).

#### 3.2 Development-Led Archaeology

ALGAO members facilitate the delivery of development-led archaeology, by advising planners of the appropriate requirements for archaeological work to be undertaken ahead of, or conditional upon, planning permission being granted. This archaeological work is then undertaken by separate, commercial providers on behalf of their clients (the recipients of planning permission), the whole process being overseen and managed by the Local Authority Archaeologists to ensure compliance.

In 2019, it was estimated that<sup>1</sup>:

- Commercial Archaeology makes an annual direct contribution of £218m to the economy
- For every £1 spent on Local Authority Planning Archaeology £15 is returned in terms of spending on sustainable development.
- The work of ALGAO members provides up to an estimated £1.3bn in savings to construction industry through reduced delay costs every year
- The provision of Local Authority based archaeological services was worth up to £245m in savings to the public purse in 2017-18

#### 3.3 Background to the Project

ALGAO wanted to determine whether services were:

- continuing or not during covid-19 lockdown in early 2020, and if so how this was being done (what software solutions were utilised etc);
- which aspects of services were continuing as normal;
- which ones required adaption;
- which couldn't be delivered;
- to learn if staff were being furloughed or redeployed.

This was an opportunity to find out what impacts the virus was having on archaeological advisory services, and what long-term impacts were anticipated.

#### 3.4 Timeline of COVID-19 and archaeological practice in the UK

A range of measures, announced and implemented by the UK and devolved Governments have directly affected archaeological practice. Some of these have been universal measures, and some have been specifically related to the construction industry, the fundamental source of the overwhelming majority of applied archaeological work and which is mediated through the planning system. Some events have been specific to the archaeology sector and relate to announcements or advice given to archaeologists and their employers.

This timeline is necessarily selective and partial.

16 March 2020	Prime Minister advises everyone in the UK against "non-essential" travel and contact with others, to curb coronavirus, as well as to work from home if possible
17 March	Announcement that £330bn will be made available in loan guarantees for businesses affected by the virus.
20 March	Introduction of furloughing through the Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme - announcement made that the government would pay 80% of wages for employees not working, up to £2,500 a month, as part of "unprecedented" measures to protect people's jobs.
23 March	Prime Minister announces a UK-wide partial lockdown, to contain the spread of the virus. The British public are instructed that they must stay at home, except for certain "very limited purposes" – shopping for basic necessities; for "one form of exercise a day"; for any medical need; and to travel to and from work when "absolutely necessary".
	Scotland's First Secretary calls to halt all non-essential construction work in Scotland
24 March	Construction Leadership Council (CLC) <u>publishes Site Operating Procedures</u> (SOP) "To implement the Government's social distancing recommendation"

Some interesting challenges around prioritising workflows now that construction is speeding back up. Planning has been disrupted. Will emerge with levels of public borrowing similar to pre-austerity. Will this lead to renewed squeeze on public budgets? Furlough: Commercial post-ex and support teams furloughed. Could create a backlog of work in areas traditionally under pressure. University field teams completely shut down and will be at a commercial disadvantage moving forwards. A lot of pre-planning work going on, and expectation that there will be a lot of pressure for planning permissions and a rush to get projects started [once the UK emerges from lockdown]."
4 May	Prospect publishes guidance for archaeologists working on construction sites, Archaeology Industry Working Group (FAME, CIfA and Prospect) issues statement
10 May	Prime Minister announces that those who cannot work from home, such as construction workers and those in manufacturing, are encouraged to return to work from the following day, but to avoid public transport if possible.

21 May	Scottish Government publishes <u>Coronavirus (COVID-19): framework for decision</u> <u>making – Scotland's route map through and out of the crisis</u>
29 May	Announcement that the Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme (furloughing) will end at the end of October. Before then, employers must pay tapering increases in wages, National Insurance and pension contributions. Self-employed people whose work has been affected by the outbreak will receive a "second and final" government grant in August.
15 June	The remainder of the Health Protection (Coronavirus, Restrictions) (England) (Amendment No. 4) Regulations 2020 (SI 588) comes into effect, allowing the general re-opening of English retail shops and public-facing businesses apart from those that are on a list of specific exclusions.
22 June	Updated <u>Coronavirus (Covid-19): construction sector guidance</u> comes into effect in Scotland
30 June	Prime Minister announces a <u>£5bn post-coronavirus recovery plan</u> for the UK that will see home building and improvements to infrastructure, and implies an intention to reduce some environmental protection measures within the planning process

### 4 Methodology

Survey questionnaires were automatically sent from the <u>EUSurvey</u> platform to all 104 ALGAO members on Monday 8<sup>th</sup> June 2020, with a deadline for responses of Friday 19<sup>th</sup> June. These were sent individually to each member (a list of email addresses was provided by ALGAO), addressing them by their first names. The survey was branded with the ALGAO logo.

This was immediately followed by an introductory email from the ALGAO Chair, alerting members and flagging its imminent arrival to encourage them to respond. On 15<sup>th</sup> June, reminders were sent from the survey platform to all ALGAO members, and following that targeted, individual reminders were sent on the 17<sup>th</sup> June from ALGAO Committee Members to members that had not yet responded.

The introduction to the survey stated:

"The Covid-19 pandemic and subsequent implementation of lockdown procedures has caused changes to industries across all sectors worldwide. ALGAO are seeking your assistance to gain further understanding into how lockdown procedures are impacting local authority archaeology services.

To enable this, Landward Research Limited have been invited to produce a survey which all ALGAO members are asked to complete. Each and every one of your responses provides us with valuable insight into your experiences, allowing us to support you going forward".

#### 4.1 Response Rate

93 useable responses were received, together with one blank response. These 93 responses represent an extremely good response rate of 89.4%.

The approach of using reminders, and then second, targeted personal reminders was extremely effective in obtaining high-quality responses.




Figure 2: Responses to the survey over time – invitations sent on 8th June, reminders on 15th and second, personalised reminders on 17th June.

### 5 National Results

Aggregate results are presented (with brief comment) for all responses from ALGAO members across the UK. Following this, tables are presented with the specific results for nine English regions, Scotland and Wales. All Northern Irish counties receive a joint service from the Department for Communities (NIEA), but unfortunately no response was received for Northern Ireland.

# 5.1 Has your archaeology service continued to deliver either a full or partial service since the Covid-19 lockdown was introduced?



A majority (69%) of archaeology advisory services to local planning authorities are continuing to deliver full services during the Covid-19 crisis. A further 30% are continuing to deliver partial services, and only 1 respondent of 93 - 1% - was not able to continue to deliver any service.

It should be noted that the survey was sent to 104 ALGAO members, and so 11 either did not answer this question or did not reply. It is possible that some of these non-respondents were unable to respond because they were not delivering any service when contacted.

Figure 4: Map of responses to 'Has your archaeology service continued to deliver either a full or partial service since the Covid-19 lockdown was introduced?'




# 5.2 Please select a checkbox for each aspect of your archaeological service delivery during lockdown.


While the majority of services are able to continue to provide advice to archaeological contractors and clients, site monitoring visits have been seriously restricted. This service has been suspended by nearly half of all ALGAO members, and only 3% are able to continue to deliver this service as normal.




Figure 7: Maps of results found in Table 4.





Figure 8: Maps of results found in Table 5.




Figure 10: Maps of results found in Table 7.







Figure 14: Map of results found in Table 11





#### 5.4 Have any of your staff been furloughed or redeployed?





# 5.5 In the mid to long term, how do you envisage Covid-19 affecting the following aspects of your service?

ALGAO members largely anticipate either decreases or standstills to budgets, staffing, the number of site visits and the level of community outreach they will undertake in the future. No respondents anticipate an increase in their future budgets, and only 1% expect an increase to their future staffing levels. They anticipate increases in virtual site visits and of the use of digital delivery in outreach.
