

- Follow / Like
- Question or comment
- Retweet



2. Discover opportunities


- People / labs / institutions / ...
- Group accounts (@realscientists, @chron_ac, ...)
- #AcademicTwitter, #PhDChat, ...

3. Tweet stuff

- Share paper, conference etc.
- Ask questions to Twitterverse
- “Day in the life” – thought/picture

4. Learn the rules

- Do h/t @
- Do CC, but with care
- Don't subtweet



5. Take care of yourself



- Disable (some) notifications
- Lists for non-essential accounts
- Mute people/words

6. Build your own community

- Who do you want to reach?
- What are your “clusters” of topics?
- Find others & engage/participate




7. Interface with real life



- Plan to meet up at conferences
- Stay in touch after
- Start (online) groups/clubs/... off Twitter

8. Spread your message

- What you add to somebody's timeline
- Study your own tweets
- Study other accounts



9. Be a real person

- Things that connect people
- Cats, running, git problems,
- Mix that is unique to you

10. Great power = great responsibility

- Your tweets get noticed

- Promote good causes & people
