








NIH recommendations

- Adhere to the principles of research integrity and publication ethics;
- Identify journals that follow best practices promoted by professional scholarly publishing organizations; and
- Avoid publishing in journals that do not have a clearly stated and rigorous peer review process

Testing the journal evaluation tool

Journal Evaluation Checker (BETA)


The UC San Diego Library has developed this checklist to help you evaluate publications to communicate your research. Although this tool can not guarantee the quality of the journal you are reviewing, it will help you document your review based on publishing best practices. Note that there is no single criterion to determine that a publisher is trustworthy or a publication is reputable. Instead, it is best to consider the cumulative effect of positive or negative indicators.





The trouble with JIF

Cons:

- can't be used to compare journals across disciplines
- Doesn't consider the nature of the citation (positive vs negative)
