Fortieth Annual Report of the Vermont Bird Records Committee

The Vermont Bird Records Committee (hereafter VBRC or the Committee) held its annual meeting on 14 November 2020 virtually via Zoom. The 40th annual report of the VBRC covers the evaluation of 76 records involving 45 species, 1 subspecies or 'identifiable subspecific form', 1 hybrid, and 1 family. Sixty-four records were accepted (84%) with the majority decided unanimously.

Highlights for 2020 included the state's first and second accepted records of Crested Caracara (*Caracara cheriway*) from Alburgh, VT and Woodstock, VT, respectively, the first accepted record of King Rail (*Rallus elegans*) from Bradford, VT, the first accepted record of Common Ringed Plover (*Charadrius hiaticula*) from Highgate, VT, and the first accepted breeding record of Black Vulture (*Coragyps atratus*) from Burlington, VT. Other notable reports from around the state include the second state record of Willow Ptarmigan (*Lagopus lagopus*), the second state record of Wilson's Storm-Petrel (*Oceanites oceanicus*), the second state record of Western Meadowlark (*Sturnella neglecta*), the third and fourth state records of Western Kingbird (*Tyrannus verticalis*), and the second state record of "Audubon's" Yellow-rumped Warbler (*Setophaga coronata auduboni*). A detailed list of all the reports from 2020 is found below.

The Vermont Bird Checklist is now at 391 species, representing 22 orders and 63 families. The names of the birds and their taxonomic arrangement follow the American Ornithological Society Checklist of North American Birds Seventh Edition (1998) and 62nd supplement (July 2021). The checklist includes one extinct species (Passenger Pigeon [*Ectopistes migratorius*]), two extirpated (Loggerhead Shrike [*Lanius Iudovicianus*] and Henslow's Sparrow [*Ammodramus henslowii*]), six hypothetical occurrences, and nine introduced species. With the addition of Black Vulture as breeding in 2020, there have now been 204 species found breeding in the state. The checklist can be viewed and downloaded at

The Vermont Bird Checklist is based on more than a century of documented observations. Reports that will expand this knowledge base are encouraged and appreciated. Consult the checklist to see species and time periods for which the Committee requests detailed documentation. An online form for documenting rare species, out-of-season encounters, and rare nesting species can be found on the Vermont Bird Records Committee website at http://vtecostudies.org/wildlife/wildlife-watching/vbrc.

For each record we present basic statistics: count of individuals, age and sex when known, location, when the bird was seen, and who submitted the report. We also indicate whether the evidence provided was a photograph, video, audio, or only a written submission. Some example images from the documentation are also presented. The Committee strongly encourages written submissions even if other media exist. When available, a link to the record in Vermont eBird is included. All records accepted by VBRC, past and present, are stored in Vermont eBird either by the VBRC, if the observer did not enter it, or via the observer(s) directly entering the record. The VBRC strongly encourages observers to enter all bird observations, rare or common, in Vermont eBird.



Reports Not Accepted

A number of factors may contribute to a record being denied acceptance by the VBRC. It is uncommon for a record to not be accepted due to a bird being obviously misidentified. More commonly, a record is not accepted because the material submitted was incomplete, insufficient, superficial, or too vague to properly document the reported occurrence while eliminating all other similar species. It is important that the simple act of not accepting a particular record should by no means indicate that the VBRC or any of its members feel the record did not occur as reported. The non-acceptance of any record simply reflects the opinion of the VBRC that the documentation, as submitted, did not meet the rigorous standards appropriate for adding data to the formal historical record. The VBRC makes every effort to be as fair and objective as possible regarding each record. All records, whether accepted or not, remain on file and can be re-submitted to the Committee if additional substantive material is presented and are available for scientific research.
