

About Reformscape

- ✓ International efforts to reform how research is recognized and rewarded in academia have gathered substantial momentum.
- ✓ But reform of research assessment is challenging because it impacts established processes, cultures and norms.
- ✓ Organizations may not always be sure where is the best place to start.
- ✓ With Reformscape they can explore how others around the world have introduced and implemented new responsible research assessment practices.
- ✓ Users can search and filter through documents on reforms affecting hiring, promotion, tenure and retention, as well as specially curated summaries of organizational efforts and their progress.

Features

- ✓ A rich variety of reform activities, including attempts to recognize open research, integrity, societal impact, equity and inclusion, and promote responsible metrics.
- ✓ More than 200 unique items of source material included (and counting).
- ✓ Covers research performing organizations from across more than 20 countries.
- ✓ Freely available.




Figure 1 Reformscape allows users to search our archive of reforms for specific types of intervention

- ✓ A live artefact that will continue updating and accepting new entries!




Figure 2 How curated summaries of research performing organizations' reforms appear in Reformscape
