





Medicine u/g (299):




Faculty u/g (90):

Overall comments:

- General 88!
 Category needs refining, but many comments about space and service – mainly positive
- Training 83 asking for more training5 delighted with the training received
- Opening hours 152 asking for 24 hour opening
- Staff 29
 Largely positive, 2 concerned with out of hours staff
- PCs 30
 Mainly concerned with lack of PCs or PCs being monopolised
- Resources 40
 Some praise, but some concerns about access and lack of resources

Staff:

- The library staff are very friendly, and very approachable.
- Consistently friendly and happy to provide assistance.
 Often come away with the impression that user issues are priorities.
- On the positive side, all staff are friendly and helpful and the stapler and hole punch are much appreciated.
- Staff generally very helpful
- Always very helpful whenever I've needed advice help or guide necessary. Very friendly and approachable.

- Staff and service is excellent
- The library staff are very friendly and helpful and getting/returning books is very easy to do. However there is never any space for group work and it is very noisy in the group area.

Environment

- Also, I feel that rules on eating in the library should be soften slightly. Being able to snack discretely would greatly improve my enjoyment of the library
- Would be nice if the quiet study area could be kept a bit quieter.
- Please maintain silence and no food rule in silent area.
 Drinks ok, but food smells and audible chewing is disrespectful to everyone and prohibition is never enforced, which is frustrating.
- The one set back I would say is the space available, it can get crowded and noise levels tend to rise.
- Generally good environment, can easily get overcrowded and loud however
- The quiet zone of the library is usually really noisy
- People are often very loud around lunchtimes
- Noise inside and just outside the library is not controlled.
 People have loud frequent group conversations in the library with little regard. Please enforce a quieter library!

Space

- I really like the silent study areas and the level of respect amongst students in this area.
- So far, very good.
- Otherwise the library is fantastic: staff, e-resources, physical resources. All great.
- Needs to be cleaner
- Would be fantastic to have more group study rooms with big whiteboards (like PBL rooms) that are available to book for 1-2hrs.
- Great environment for learning
- Generally of a high standard.
- Entry into library using cards can be quite awkward when it takes a while

- Review access to electronic resources and authentication issues
- Investigate perceived gaps in our collection
- Monitor use of PCs and ensuring PCs are not blocked by unattended belongings
- "Respect" campaign
- Suitable furniture for group study space
